New name, same one-on-one care

The Sunshine Coast Private Hospital at Buderim is now known as Buderim Private Hospital.

With a number of new hospitals operating in the area with a similar title to its previous name, and after



talking to the local community, employees and doctors, it was clear it was the right time for a change of name.

The new name, Buderim Private Hospital, not only honours the hospital's history and strong ties to the local community but also seeks to recognise the unique care and services that Buderim Private Hospital provides.

Since the hospital is located centrally on the Sunshine Coast, changing the name to the Buderim Private Hospital makes the physical location much clearer to the entire Sunshine Coast Community, including how accessible it is to the Maroochydore, Caloundra in the south, Noosa in the north and hinterland towns such as Maleny.

The hospital's onsite radiology service provider, Sunshine Coast Medical Imaging, has also changed its name and is now known as Buderim Private Medical Imaging.



Robotic surgery introduced to help prostate cancer patients

Sunshine Coast men now have access to leading robotic surgical services to treat prostate cancer at the Buderim Private Hospital.





\$3 million in the Da Vinci Xi surgical robotic system which will allow minimally invasive procedures to be conducted primarily in the field of urology.

The introduction of this service has been closely developed and implemented with support from The Wesley Hospital, which like Buderim Private Hospital, is also part of the UnitingCare Health. The Wesley Hospital has the largest robotic program in Australia and was recently recognised as Australia's first Centre of Excellence in Robotic Surgery by international accrediting body, the Surgical Review Corporation (SRC).

Urologist Dr Tim Nathan is the hospital's lead of the robotic surgical program. Dr Nathan trained in robotic surgery at The Wesley Hospital and has been performing robotic prostatectomies for the past three years.

Joining Dr Nathan in performing robotic prostate surgery will be The Wesley Hospital's surgeon, Dr Troy Gianduzzo, who was recently awarded an Associate Professorship at the University of Queensland.

The purchase of the Da Vinci Xi surgical robotic system further strengthens the Buderim Private Hospital's commitment to men's health and its provision of services to treat a range of common health conditions, including both benign and malignant prostate issues.

Last year, two of the hospital's urologists, Dr Tony Gianduzzo and Dr Tim Nathan, introduced Queensland's first robotic transperineal prostatic biopsy system, the Mona Lisa BioBot. This system enables better diagnosis, grading and treatment choices for patients with clinically significant prostate cancer.
